

ASSESSING INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE WITH SDM® TOOLS AND SOP

Recent updates to California's Structured Decision Making® (SDM) system include foundational updates to definitions related to assessing thresholds for child welfare intervention based on intimate partner violence. These updates align with survivor-centered practice, the integrated core practice model, and Safety-Organized Practice (SOP). This training is intended to support fidelity implementation of the updated SDM tools and support best practices in child welfare decision making regarding intimate partner violence using SDM tools and SOP. Facilitators will engage participants in critical thinking about their practice when there is a pattern of coercive control and violence, support participants' awareness of their implicit biases, and review traditional and safety-organized techniques when working with perpetrators. This training will also review best practices for father inclusion when serving families experiencing intimate partner violence.
