In July 2015, a 7-year-old developmentally delayed child arrived in emergency room with life-threatening injuries, including a spleen injury related to severe bruising to the abdomen. It became known that the department had previous contact with the family. Examine history prior to July to determine whether the department followed proper procedure in its prior contacts.

#### Screener Narrative

Anonymous caller says the parents don't take proper care of their children. Caller says there are five children; the youngest is about 3, and there is "something wrong with that kid." Caller says child is not talking at all yet. Older children range in age up to about 10 or so. Parents do not supervise them closely, so the little ones will run into the street or be outside late at night. They all look skinny and often beg for food from the neighbors. The house is filthy, with dirty clothes and dirty dishes everywhere.

Home visit attempted. No one was home.

### 8/18/2011

Father was home, but no one else. The house was messy, but not unsafe. Father has been looking for work, so they are on TANF assistance right now. He acknowledges that it is pretty tough financially and they have used food pantries, but he says the children are fed adequately. He says he had a dispute with a neighbor last week over loud music the neighbor was playing. He asked them to turn it down and they wouldn't. So he called the police. He believes this call is in retaliation. Worker said the children would need to be seen since the call was made.

#### 8/19/2011

Home visit; interviewed mother and younger children. The youngest could not be interviewed due to age. All other children report good relationships with their parents. They deny physical abuse. They indicate that they are getting enough to eat. The house was picked up a bit compared to yesterday. Mother states there was one time that the youngest ran into the street. Mother stopped her right away, and is working on teaching her to stay on the sidewalk. She states children are in the house by 9:00 p.m. Children had no injuries and, though thin, did not appear underfed.

### School Visit for Older Children

The two older children were interviewed at school. Both children were neatly dressed and appeared healthy. Both denied lacking for food and confirmed that they are in the house by 9:00 p.m.

Interviewed child at school. Seven-year-old child victim is in second grade and has a developmental disability. Her speech is poor and her ability to answer questions was limited. She showed me her "owie," and I observed some bluish-purple areas on both upper thighs, toward the back. There were some faintly darker parallel lines within the bruised area that looked about like adult fingers. Child did not provide a story for how she got the bruises. She did not engage much in conversation at all. Other than the noted bruises, she appeared healthy and well cared for.

Interviewed 8-year-old sister who attends the same school. She is not developmentally delayed and engaged well in conversation. She said she did not know her sister had bruises and had no idea where she got them. She said her daddy and mommy usually use time-outs, and sometimes use spankings. She denied ever having injuries from spankings.

Home visit. Interviewed mother at home. Mother denied any knowledge of any injury to child victim. She said that child victim is developmentally delayed, and sometimes decides to do things she shouldn't, so needs to be taught so she can stay safe. For example, she runs into the street, and she grabs things from the stove. Mother and father sometimes do use spankings because child victim can't really be reasoned with. However, mother denies that spankings ever leave an injury.

Spoke with mother about how family is doing in general. They have a lot to manage with five children, one of whom has a significant developmental delay. Also, mother's brother is temporarily staying with them while he is getting over a divorce, looking for a job, and trying to get settled. Mother stated the uncle is never responsible for the children and would have no cause to discipline any of them. Mother denies any substance abuse, domestic violence, or mental health issues. The house was well kept. The three older children arrived home from school and each denied knowing about any bruises on child victim. They all reported that there is no concern about being injured by their parents and they are not afraid to be at home.

Neither father nor uncle was present.

Worker observed no safety threats at this time. Will attempt to interview father and uncle. Mother will have father call to arrange a time for a visit.
